



CITY OF PLEASANT VALLEY - ORDINANCE #7

AN ORDINANCE PROTECTING PUBLIC SIGNS AND SIGNALS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLEASANT VALLEY:

SECTION ONE. A public sign or signal is any sign, signal, notice or marker owned by, erected by, or authorized by the municipality, for the purpose of displaying information, warnings, or directions to the public.

SECTION TWO. No person shall affix, or direct another person(s) to affix, any object(s) to a public sign or signal located within the City of Pleasant Valley without prior consent of City Council or representative(s) delegated by said Council.

SECTION THREE. No person shall cause obstruction, or direct another person(s) to cause obstruction, to any public sign or signal within the City of Pleasant Valley in such a manner in which it was originally intended, without prior consent of City Council or representative(s) delegated by said council.

SECTION FOUR. No person shall install, or direct another person(s) to install, any public sign or signal within the City of Pleasant Valley without prior consent of City Council or representative(s) delegated by said Council.

SECTION FIVE. No person shall relocate, modify or remove any public sign or signal located within the City of Pleasant Valley without the prior consent of City Council or representative(s) delegated by said Council.

SECTION SIX. Failure to comply with this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor. Any person who violates this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than \$1000.00 for each violation.
